
- · Create, update, and track progress on their professional learning plan

- Download and share high interest, engaging lessons, assessments, assignments, resources and materials from colleagues they know and trust







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- · Stay informed about school news and events
- Engage with their students' teachers and other school staff
- Take advantage of learning resources and materials geared toward parents

HOW STUDENTS MANAGE THEIR LEARNING USING AN LMS

- · Download course content
- Access and submit assignments (video, audio, and text files)
- Work on documents simultaneously with their project partner(s)
- Provide their opinions and factual knowledge in group discussions
- Build a portfolio of achievements by collecting and sharing work artifacts
- · Take assessments
- · Gain feedback from teachers and peers on assignments
- Gather input and ideas through digital collaborative learning opportunities



- · Design, create and publish a web page for each class
- Publish class content and collect student work on class web pages
- Post assignments for specific students or groups of students
- Post digital resources and materials (study guides, Venn Diagrams, etc.) needed to complete assignments
- · Post reminders and announcements
- \cdot Create polls, quizzes, and assessments



- Administer assessments and track student progress
- Curate curriculum from a variety of sources: teacher authored, embedded, imported, or uploaded
- Annotate, grade, and assess student work via rubric and gradebook
- Respond to student questions on assignments
- · Comment on student discussion posts
